What are they?

Invasive weeds are aggressive plants that have been introduced into an environment outside of their native range. They grow rapidly, reproduce profusely and outcompete native plants. They also lower plant diversity, change aesthetics, inhibit recreational activities and can pose a threat to lake clarity due to soil erosion.

Why should I care?

- Invasive weeds can outcompete native plant species
- Weed infestations decrease trail and recreational opportunities
- Invasive species decrease property values
- Spotted knapweed has been designated as noxious by Nevada law, requiring control efforts by property owners

What can I do?

- Avoid: Stay on trails and roads, avoid infestations
- Clean: Clean boots, tires and clothing when leaving the area
- **Pets:** Keep pets on trails, check pets for weed seeds
- •Manage: Control weeds on your property
- Participate: Talk to neighbors and friends, join community clean-up groups, participate in local weed group meetings
